George Washington Carver




Scientist and inventor who worked with plants and who was known as the "Peanut Man" because he invented hundreds of products that used peanuts.


Minister and activist that became the most visible leader of the Civil Rights Movement.




Mae C. Jemison




Astronaut and first black woman to travel into space.








Louis Armstrong


One of the first African American tennis players and the first to win the Grand Slam title.


Poet, dancer, screenwriter, and award-winning author known for her book / Know Why the Caged Bird Sings.








Mathematician whose calculations helped NASA launch their first flights that sent astronauts to the moon.
